The position is funded by the Emmy Noether Grant *Reproducing kernel Hilbert spaces and dilation theory* of Michael Hartz. Applicants should have a background in at least one of the following subjects

- functional analysis, especially operator theory or operator algebras,
- complex analysis,
- harmonic analysis,

and an interest in working on the interactions between these areas.

The position is payed according to the standard German pay scale 100% E13 TV-L. There are no teaching obligations. Starting date is no later than Fall 2022.

**Qualifications:** PhD in mathematics, or related field. Knowledge of German is welcome but not required.
